
Methodology

- A total of 500 random telephone interviews were conducted with BC adults, 18 years of age or over.
- The margin of error on this sample size is +/- 4.4% at the 95% confidence level.
- All interviews were conducted January 14th 21st, 2009.
- All interviewing was completed from the Mustel Group CATI (computer assisted telephone interviewing) facility in Vancouver where interviewers are continuously supervised and monitored for quality purposes.
- Industry-standard, multi-stage random selection techniques were employed during interviewing. On completion of the survey, at the data processing stage, weighting adjustments were made to bring basic characteristics of age, gender and region into their correct known proportions based on 2006 Statistics Canada population figures.

Investment in Public & Post Secondary Education as a Key Component of Economic Stimulus



Level of Support for the BC Government Presenting a Deficit Budget to Maintain Public & Post Secondary Education Funding



Level of Concern Regarding Neighbourhood Public School Closures



Level of Concern BC Public Schools Will Receive Necessary Seismic Upgrading



Factor that Most Prevents British Columbians Attending a College or University



Level of Support for Additional Funding for Public Universities, Colleges & Training Institutes



Priority for Funding the Maintenance of BC's University and College Buildings and Grounds



Level of Importance of the Increased Funding of University-Based Research



Perception that BC has an Adequate Supply of Skilled Trades People


